## [Remarks]

1. According to the rules of the school, university students are required to pass the "service learning", "English proficiency", "information ability", "Chinese ability", "sports ability" and "professional basic ability" checks.

2. The Liberal Studies programme is required to take at least 12 credits before graduation. The courses are divided into three areas: "Humanism", "Social" and "Nature". Each area is divided into two categories, "Core" and "Extension". Students must graduate in at least 2 credits in each class in each field. Graduation credits only recognize 12 credits of general education courses, and more general courses of credits are not included in graduation credits. 3. The compulsory courses "Institutional Internship" and "Social Work Internship (II)" are practical internship courses. Please choose one of the courses. However, those who take "social work internships (2)" can only complete social work internships. ) Applicable.

4. The educational scores of the education course and general education are not included in the graduation credits.

5. The department recognizes that the course is up to 19 credits.

6. Students who are not members of this structure are required to take the newly added compulsory courses of the structure. The credits can be counted as the professional electives.

7. Credits for cross-disciplinary credits not included in the graduation structure are recognized as external credits.

8. Those who need to re-submit the required courses of the majors of the Department can complete the courses of the same subject name or content of other departments with the consent of the Director, and can be included in the graduation credits.

9. Elective courses in this mandatory subject structure list can be traced back to students enrolled before the 108 academic year.
